Dear Church,

As you know, I enjoy using a bit of humour in my sermons on Sundays. I thought I'd use this opportunity to share with you some of my favourite jokes and humorous stories from the past year or so. As a bonus, I wanted to also share a little bit of how these jokes fit into the themes and messages of the sermons. Hopefully you will find this entertaining and inspirational. The first joke is one I told on Easter Sunday, and I was told this one was the best joke I've told so far. I think you will see how it fit into the Easter message:

A man, his wife, and his mother-in-law went on vacation to the Holy Land. While they were there, the mother-in-law passed away. The undertaker told them, "It's going to cost you £5,000 to ship her home for a funeral. Or you can bury her here in the Holy Land for £150." The man thought about it for a while and told the undertaker he would just have her shipped home. The undertaker asked, "Why would you spend £5,000 to ship your mother-in-law home when it would be wonderful to be buried here and spend only £150?" The man said, "I've heard about a man who died here in the Holy Land. He was buried here and three days later, He rose from the dead.... I just can't take that chance."

When preaching on giving, I shared this one to lighten what is sometimes a heavy topic:

A little boy was given a £5 note to put in the offering basket. When the offering came around, he wouldn't put it in the bag. But after the end of the service, when he went to shake the pastor's hand, he pulled out the £5 and gave it to the pastor. The pastor asked him, "Why are you giving me this money? Why didn't you put it in the offering bag?" The boy answered, "Because my mummy told me you're the poorest pastor we've ever had!"

Speaking on the subjects of having a right attitude and putting others first are always important. These stories helped illustrate those points:

- Two women were on a bus, fighting over the last available seat. The driver had to intervene, so he shouted, "Let the ugly one take the seat." Both ladies stayed standing the rest of their journeys.
- My brother and I used to fight in the pool. Then one day our mum told us to divide the pool in half and to each stay on our own side. I picked the top half.

- Speaking of my brother, it's hard for me to talk about our relationship. He took going to jail really badly. He went on a hunger strike, he even refused drink. He would spit at people, and he spoke terribly about all of us in the family. Ever since then, we said we'd never play Monopoly again.
- And since I mentioned Monopoly, I should point out that the game is not relevant any more. There's free parking, guaranteed income just for moving around, you can buy property, there's a tax on luxury, and rich people can go to jail.
- Sometimes we are very hard on ourselves. A man was asked to describe himself in 3 words. He thought about it and said, "Bad at following directions."

The Christian message is life-changing, but not everyone accepts it. Here's a joke that you might have to think about...

There's a story of a Jewish son, 18 years old, who tells his father he is moving out. The son returns a year later and tells his father that he's no longer Jewish and has converted to Christianity. The father is upset and calls his friend, who is also Jewish. "You won't believe this: My son David moved out for a year and came back and told me he converted to Christianity."

His friend says, "You won't believe this: My son Benjamin moved away for a year. When he came back, HE converted to Christianity, too!" Both upset, they call their rabbi and explain what happened. The rabbi listened to both their stories, then shared this: "You won't believe this, but my son Joshua moved away. When he came back, he told me he converted to Christianity, too!"

The rabbi suggests they all pray and tell God what had happened to all three of their sons. The rabbi tells God that all three men had sons who moved away and converted to Christianity. Then they listen, and God says to them, "You won't believe this..."

This one teaches the importance of keeping our mouth shut and exercising self-control:

There was a single man living at home with his father, who was a wealthy business owner. The father was sick, however, and told his son Edward that he would give him the business and a large fortune when he died. But the father said he had one condition before he gave away the business – he wanted to see Edward get married. So Edward began thinking of all he needed to do to prepare to take over his father's business and a large amount of money. Rather than waste it, he decided to get some advice from a financial planner. When he met the financial planner, she was the most beautiful woman he had ever seen. She was wise, intelligent, charming, and single, too! Edward tried to listen to all her advice, but he was so distracted with her beauty. Losing his self-control, he interrupted her financial advice and told her, "Listen, I'm just an ordinary guy, but my father will die soon and leave me all this money. Just make it simple for me." The woman thanked him and asked him for his business card. Three weeks later, she became his stepmother! I'll close with my personal favourite Church joke. I used this one for "Back to Church Sunday."

A Christian is stranded on a deserted island for many years. He's finally rescued when a passing ship notices his smoke signals. A team of sailors lands on the island, and they prepare to take the Christian off the Island. But first he offers to give them a tour of his island. As he walks them down the coastline, the first building he shows them is a simple hut. He explains that this is his house. He then proudly shows them a second building he built himself, which he says is where he goes to church. Then one of the sailors notices a third building down the coast and asks, "What's this building for?" The Christian says, "Oh, that's the church I used to go to."

The Bible says in Proverbs 17:22, "A cheerful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones." I'll do my best to continue to provide laughter and cheer by sharing only the best jokes with you each week. Handy Household hints

You can keep your produce fresh by

Keeping strawberries in a jam jar

Open your lettuce and lay it on kitchen roll in fridge.

Wrap celery in foil and keep in fridge.

You will need: 100g margarine

4 level tablespoons golden syrup

75g granulated sugar

225g rolled oats

Pinch of salt.

Grease a square, shallow tin, about 19cm.

Put margarine and syrup in a pan and leave over a low heat until margarine has melted. Remove from heat and add sugar, oats and salt. Mix thoroughly.

Turn mixture into prepared tin and cook in a very moderate oven (160oC) for 30 – 40 minutes until golden brown.

Leave to cool in tin for 5 minutes then cut into 12 bars. Place on a wire tray

to finish cooling.


