"Space: The final frontier."

I'll admit it – I was a "Trekkie" growing up. My dad used to watch the original series of Star Trek, but, as a kid, I didn't really enjoy Kirk, Spock, and the Enterprise crew. That changed when the next generation of Star Trek came out in the 1980s, conveniently called "Star Trek: The Next Generation." I watched re-runs of the show after school every day until I had watched the entire series, I went to Star Trek conventions as a young teenager (even winning second place in a trivia contest), and I spent all my allowance money on action figures and model spaceships.

As I think about the theme of our summer Holiday Club being "Galactic Heroes", I wonder if any of the Star Trek toys from my childhood would be any good for decorating my space-themed "den." Of course, another space-themed franchise – Star Wars – seems to be more popular today. There are so many galactic adventures and superhero movies out now that I can't even keep up with everything going on.

Even though I grew out of Star Trek when the last continuous series ended in 2005 (though the recent revival of the franchise has even more shows out now), I still remember the sense of exploration and adventure I had when I watched the show. I think back on the characters, racing around the universe, seeking out new life and new civilizations, and boldly going where no one has gone before. While Star Trek found a way to eliminate religion from the future utopia it envisioned, I believe we can still find ways for it to inspire our faith. If you've been to ABC in the past few months, you will have heard our sermon series on the book of Philippians. In Chapter 3 of Paul's letter to his friends at the church in Philippi, he challenges them to follow his example of pursuing Christ with everything he has. "Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead," he says, "I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."

You see, for Paul, the goal was even greater than exploring strange new worlds or boldly going where no one has gone before. His ongoing mission was to pursue the prize that God had commissioned him to – heaven. That's even more "out of this world" than what we see on the TV or movie screen.

Paul's battle wasn't against the Romulans or Klingons, or against Thanos or Darth Vader or whatever mythical bad guy the entertainment writers can come up with. His battle was against spiritual powers and those working against Christ – the devil, demons, false teachers, idolaters, and other "enemies of the cross."

The galactic adventure Paul faced – which he says is our journey, too – is a battle against the things of this world (see Philippians 3:19-20). Paul said that, as Christians, we are citizens of heaven. We are the true galactic heroes, on an epic spiritual trek to claim the prize that has already been won for us.

You see, it's not because of our own efforts that we will become the stars of this ongoing trek. We can't win the eternal star wars by fighting battles on our own. It's because Christ as the ultimate victor, the extreme example of sacrifice, and the supreme sovereign who saves us, made a way for us to be part of His crew. Our heavenly Captain has already won the victory – defeating death and sin and hell – and He continues fighting for us. Fictional and even earthly 'heroes' have nothing on our Saviour – because 'He rose' from the dead after conquering death on the cross.

In this celestial conflict surrounding us each day, we can have safety and security in knowing that heaven is our final destination. This life is a trek – not to some unknown destination in the stars – but to seek out and take hold of God's Truth found in His Word and in a relationship with Jesus Christ.

Deuteronomy 5:33 says, "Walk in obedience to all that the LORD your God has commanded you, so that you may live and prosper and prolong your days in the land that you will possess." Another way to put that is:

Follow God, and Live Long and Prosper.

Do you know ....


why geese and some other birds fly in a V formation when flying long distances?

### Practice makes Perfect...

The same is true of the Bible. It is an important part of learning about the Christian life, but many people leave the Bible closed, thinking that just having it on a table where they can see it will help them.

Sometimes they will open it or page through it without reading it. It doesn't help you to have a Bible unless you read it regularly, study it, ask God to make it meaningful to you, let it inspire and direct you, and spend time thinking about what it says.

The Bible doesn't do you any good closed, or open and unread. You need to read it, study it and live by it.

In the Church lounge there are Bible reading notes that may help you to make a start – pick up a copy anytime, also consider joining a house group where again meeting with other Christians, talking about a particular passage will help you understand the meaning and what it means for you.



. "We found the sand was not like the sand in the brochure. Your brochure shows the sand as white but it was more yellow."


. "No-one told us there would be fish in the water. The children were scared."


