

Dear church,

Over the last year or so, I've been noticing that my eyesight has been changing more rapidly than ever before. Whereas I used to be able to wear contacts, lately I can barely see when I put them on. I now have to take even my glasses off to read. And if something is at the awkward distance between not needing glasses and needing glasses, then it's like my brain doesn't know what to do with what my eyes are seeing.

I suppose the writer of Proverbs in the Bible might be onto something when he wrote, "Where there is no vision, the people perish" (Proverbs 29:18, KJV). Just like we want our eyes to be able to see, we also need vision for our lives.

Just like our eyesight over time, our vision for life changes. For example, when you're single, you might have a vision to start a career and get married. Then, once time has passed and you're already married and settled down, your vision might be to raise your children and look for promotions in your field of work. Over time, you vision changes. Yet it is still important to have a vision and to give yourself something to be looking forward to.

The same is true for our church's vision. This year we have a new vision statement for Aylestone Baptist: Growing, Learning, Experiencing, and Sharing God's Love. We've recently finished a teaching series going over each part of the new vision. I thought I would share this here, for all to read.

Growing: We want to be a church that is growing in every area. Growth just doesn't mean we have more people attending. Being a growing church means we are digging our roots deeper in discipleship, adding and multiplying through small groups, expanding our influence and opportunities in the community and increasingly impacting the world with God's love. We see this growth happening, and our vision is to see even more.

Learning: As a church and as Christians, learning about God and His love is foundational to our existence. We are always learning, always becoming more like Christ, always seeking to understand more and more of the Bible. Teaching God's Word and applying it to our lives is a large part of what we do as a church each week. Our vision is for us all to learn God's love more and more.

Experiencing: When we come to church, we don't just show up to sing songs and hear some teaching. We attend church because we ARE the church. Our relationship with God is not just head knowledge or some kind of religious duty – it is a real, dynamic, personal relationship with the Creator of the universe! We experience Him through worship, prayer, fellowship with others, teaching, serving, giving, and sharing His love. While we don't pursue experiences for the sake an experience, we pursue Jesus – and He reveals Himself to us. Our vision is to experience Him more and for others to have a real relationship with Him.

Sharing: We share God's love by proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ. We live our lives in a way that brings glory to God so that others will see His light shining in us. Our vision is to share His message and His love with those closest to us, with our community, and around the world.

God's Love: With God's love as our vision, everything else falls into place. God is love, and He gives us a command to love others. He gave us the greatest example of love in His Son, Jesus Christ. Our vision is to grow in God's love, learn God's love, experience God's love, and share God's love.

God once told an Old Testament prophet, Habakkuk, "Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so he may run who reads it" (Habakkuk 2:2, ESV). Hopefully our church's vision has been plainly given. Now that we've read it, let's run with it!




The Lord is my Shepherd.....

Immediately after World War II the Allied Armies gathered up many hungry, homeless children and placed them in large camps. There the children were abundantly fed and cared for. However, at night they did not sleep well. They seemed restless and afraid.

Finally, a psychologist hit on a solution. After the children were put to bed, they each received a slice of bread to hold. If they wanted more to eat, more was provided, but this particular slice was not to be eaten – but just to hold.

The slice of bread produced marvellous results. The child would go to sleep, subconsciously feeling it would have something to eat tomorrow. That assurance gave the child a calm and peaceful rest.



In the Twenty-third Psalm, David points out something of the same feeling in the sheep when he says, "The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want." Instinctively, the sheep knows the shepherd has made plans for its grazing tomorrow. It knows the shepherd made ample provision for it today, so will he tomorrow. So the sheep lies down in the fold with, figuratively speaking, the piece of bread in its hand.

The Psalm does not begin with a petition asking God for something; rather it is a calm statement of fact – "The Lord is my Shepherd". We do not have to beg God for things.

St. Paul says, "My God shall supply all you need." David puts it, "The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want."

With that faith we can work today without worrying about tomorrow.
